

Top: Cast Iron Door Knobs;


Legs and Top: Part of Edwardian Lamp;

Gas Pipe Tubing







1952-53 Married Corry and built a nouse at a Gien Eden property

From Peter's Apostle series of paintings from 1954-58






In 1956 Peter established a company Scrollo Ltd making domestic and ornamental items out of No. 8 steel wire. This business was very successful, and ran for over three years.

- •1961-87 Designed fittings for the El Matador restaurant and others






In his Fifties to Seventies

Peter's propensity to incorporate old weapons such as shotguns and bayonets is his way of illustrating the futility of war.

Corry sadly passed away in 2003, before Peter held his "Precious Past" 2004 exhibition at Corban Estate Arts Centre.

Before he died of cancer, age 79 in 2006, Peter gifted his collection of over 100 works worth close to a million dollars to the Waitakere City Council.

His last creation, a sculptured key to open the new civic centre in Henderson was also donated to the council in September 2006.

The Peter Sauerbier collection is in Auckland council storage. His wish was for the collection to be displayed at Corban's Arts Estate.

In 2009 Peter's family were frustrated that plans to upgrade and extend the arts centre were in limbo, and might not happen for another 10 years.

Council had at this time started a proposal for a 3 year tour of the artworks around the country.

The Auckland Council Art Collection Services Manager Peter Tilley has indicated that there are plans in the wind for the collection.
