





Henry Atkinson, Rangiwai Hill house, c.1920




Titirangi township from Rangiwai Hill, 1920.










- 1947-67 Owned and lived in by Harry and Edna Atkinson
- 1967 Bought by Waitemata County Council as the Titirangi office administration centre
- 1978 Council moved to Henderson and house became the Titirangi Community House
- 2002 New Community
 House opened near Library
- 2006 Council sold the house




- Tibor Donner (1907 1993)

 1932 Graduated with distinction from Auckland University School of Architecture


 45 year career early 1930s mid 1970s

- Civic Administration Building (1954-60)


